Early launch of KCL BIM Research Report

BIM raises basic legal and contractual questions as to who provides what project information, when it is best provided and how it should be used and relied upon. Case studies show direct links between the success of BIM and the use of procurement models and appropriate contract terms.

Yet concerns as to the reliability of BIM and its possible impact on team members' liability have fuelled a more defensive contractual approach, which can restrict the ability of BIM users to work confidently and efficiently.

The KCL Centre of Construction Law, sponsored by the [Society of Construction Law](#) and the [Association of Consultant Architects](#), has led a Research Group of specialists analysing a range of BIM projects. They will report on how procurement models and construction contracts can influence and be influenced by BIM at level 2 and level 3.

Conference delegates will be provided with an advance copy of the research report "*Enabling BIM through Procurement and Contracts*", which will then be finalised and relaunched to include conference contributions.
